Women, Peace and Security: Opportunities and Challenges in the Implementation of UN

Resolution 1325 (Berlin, 05 March, 19:00 – 20:30 h followed by a reception) Strengthening the Women and Peace and Security Agenda is one of the main focuses of Germany's membership in the UN Security Council in 2019/20. The aim of UN Resolution 1325 is to involve women in all phases of crisis prevention, conflict management and peacebuilding, to strengthen their role in peace processes and to protect them from sexual violence in (post-) conflicts and in refugee contexts. Together we like to share and discuss: What has been achieved in the past 20 years since the adoption of Resolution 1325? How does the participation of women in peace processes, but also in armed combat operations, change the dynamics of such processes? To what extent has the Federal Government built on pioneers such as Sweden and what important impulses has Germany provided during its membership in the UN Security Council so far? What will remain after 2020?

What does it mean to be a man and a feminist?

Many male colleagues wonder which role they can take on when it comes to the promotion of gender equality. Discussions on gender equality are mostly dominated by women. But what does gender equality mean for men, personally and professionally? How can men stand up for the abolishment of unjust privileges and the promotion of gender equality? What kind of stake do they have in this topic? We want to shed light on these questions, listen to a stimulating input of an external speaker, and offer room for discussion. Not only male but also diverse and female colleagues are invited to attend the event, as gender equality can only achieved if we join forces. *Let's team up and work together.*
